Annex 7: Mechanisms to hold U.S.A. responsible Domestically

- A. Internal mechanism of the U.S. is the U.S. Congress' Apology to the native Hawaiian people for the overthrow (See Annex 2, public law 103-150) and a call for redressing the violations committed.
- B. Failure by the U.S. government, the State of Hawaii, or the judicial system of both the Federal and the State governments to address this international violation and the governments' continued insistence that notwithstanding these historical violations, Hawaii is well within the U.S. arrangement of States and the issue of its Statehood, and of decolonization are only at the whim of the U.S. Congress or the Courts which hold supremacy according to the U.S. constitution.
